During the course of philosophy, students are evaluated on a 100- point system. Of these, 50 points are allocated to the current and intermediate results (60% of 50 points are current control, independent study and 40% are intermediate control), and 50 points are allocated to the final control results. Students whose total score of current and intermediate points is less than 30 points are not admitted to the final control exam.
